I am excited for our students and staff members to begin to expand educational success through the 1:1 strategy. Technology provides an endless opportunity for growth and development for our children.

Thank you to Ms. Sally Morton, school nurse and health sciences instructor, for her efforts in coordinating a suicide awareness and prevention event at Wood Memorial High School. Representatives of Deaconess Cross Pointe will be at WM on Wednesday, September 13, 2017 to provide training to instructors in our school corporation. This will be conducted from 3:45 – 5:15pm. An informational session for the public, including parents, students, and anyone with interest, will be held beginning at 6:00pm. The location for both times will be the cafeteria.

Our children face many stress points in their lives, with too many of these occurring outside of their control.
